

Identification documents required for fingerprinting

This document lists the types of identification documents accepted by U.S. Bank when verifying an applicant's identity. Applicants must provide two forms of identification, one of which must be a valid, unexpired, government issued photo ID. All identification documents must be original (not copies), current, valid and unexpired.

Acceptable photo IDs include

- State-issued Driver's License*
- State-issued Non-Driver's License ID Card
- U.S. Passport
- Military Identification Card
- Work Visa with Photo
- Department of Defense Common Access Card
- Foreign Driver's License
- Foreign Passport with Appropriate Immigration Document(s)

Acceptable secondary IDs include

- Birth Certificate
- Marriage Certificate
- Citizenship or Naturalization Certificate
- School ID with Photograph
- Voter Registration Card
- Draft Record
- Native American Tribal Document
- U.S. Active Duty/Retiree/Reservist Military Identification Card (000 10-2)
- Federal Government Personal Identity Verification Card (PIV)
- U.S. Tribal or Bureau of Indian Affairs Identification Card
- Social Security Card
- Court Order for Name Change/Gender Change/Adoption/Divorce
- U.S. Government Issued Consular Report of Birth Abroad
- Certificate of Citizenship (N560)
- Certificate of Naturalization (N550)
- INS I-551 Resident Alien Card issued since 1997
- INS I-688 Temporary Resident Identification Card
- INS I-688B, I-766 Employment Authorization Card
